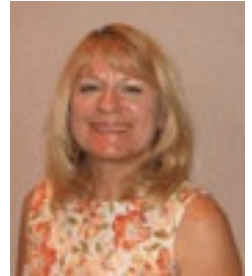




Pacific Breezes
